
All Wilmington University students, faculty and staff have borrowing privileges at all Delaware Public Libraries.

Since joining the Delaware Library Catalog,

faculty and staff have the ability to borrow from 46 libraries throughout Delaware; this includes all the public libraries and other area libraries.

To borrow items from other libraries, users must place a hold through the catalog. Before performing a search, change the library from Wilmington University Library to ALL. From the results list, click Place Hold above the item's image. Choose Wilmington University Library, or your desired library, as the pickup location. You will be notified through e-mail when your material arrives.

WU DISSERTATIONS ARE NOW OPENLY ACCESSIBLE

Our Wilmington University dissertation collection is available openly online, in full-text.

Beginning in 2010, the full-text of all newly completed Wilmington University dissertations will be made available online through the Library's institutional repository. Formerly only available through Proquest, dissertations will now all be added electronically to the online collection. 
