Featured Staff Member: Anna Claire McCloskey

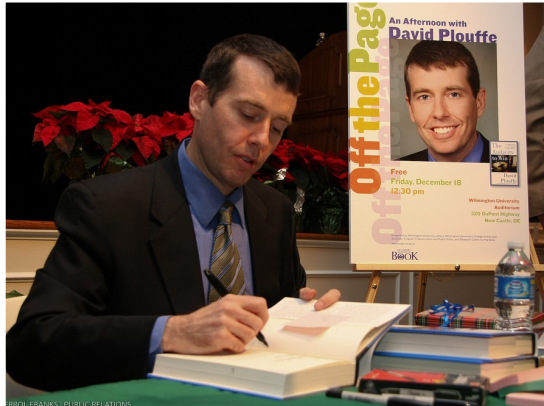

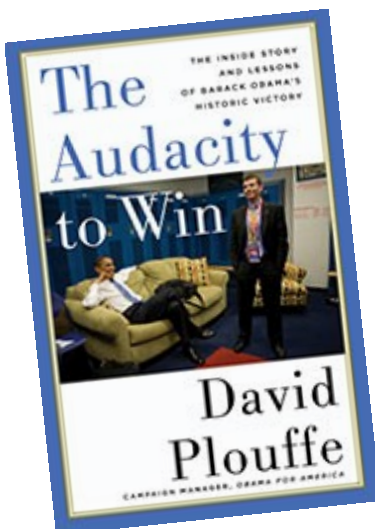


DAVID PLOUFFE DELIVERS FASCINATING WORDS TO WILMINGTON UNIVERSITY CROWD

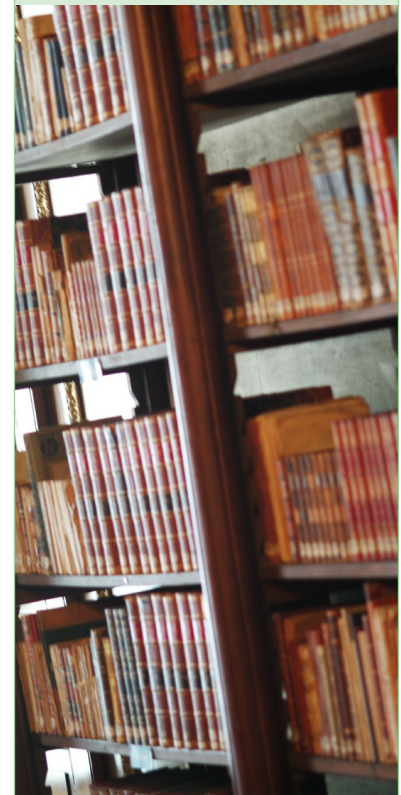
AGELINE DATABASE NOW PART OF EBSCOHOST

Access to the AgeLine Database is now available on a trial basis through Ebscohost.

AgeLine focuses exclusively on the population aged 50+ and issues of aging. AgeLine is the premier source for the literature of social gerontology and includes aging-related content from the health sciences, psychology, sociology, social work, economics, and public policy. It covers aging-related issues for professionals in aging services, health, business, law, and mental health.

Designed for researchers, students, professionals, and general consumers, this database addresses aging issues from individual, national, and global perspectives. This database indexes over 600 journals, books, book chapters, reports, dissertations, consumer guides, and educational videos. Publication coverage is from 1978 to the present.

NEW LIBRARY CATALOG SYSTEM

The Library joins the Delaware Library Catalog System

You may have noticed some changes when searching for Library materials. Over the Holiday break, the Library merged catalogs with the statewide Delaware Library Catalog System. Previously called WebCat, our catalog system is now part of a multi-library statewide catalog system.

WHAT TO EXPECT

WHAT WILL THIS MEAN FOR LIBRARY USERS?

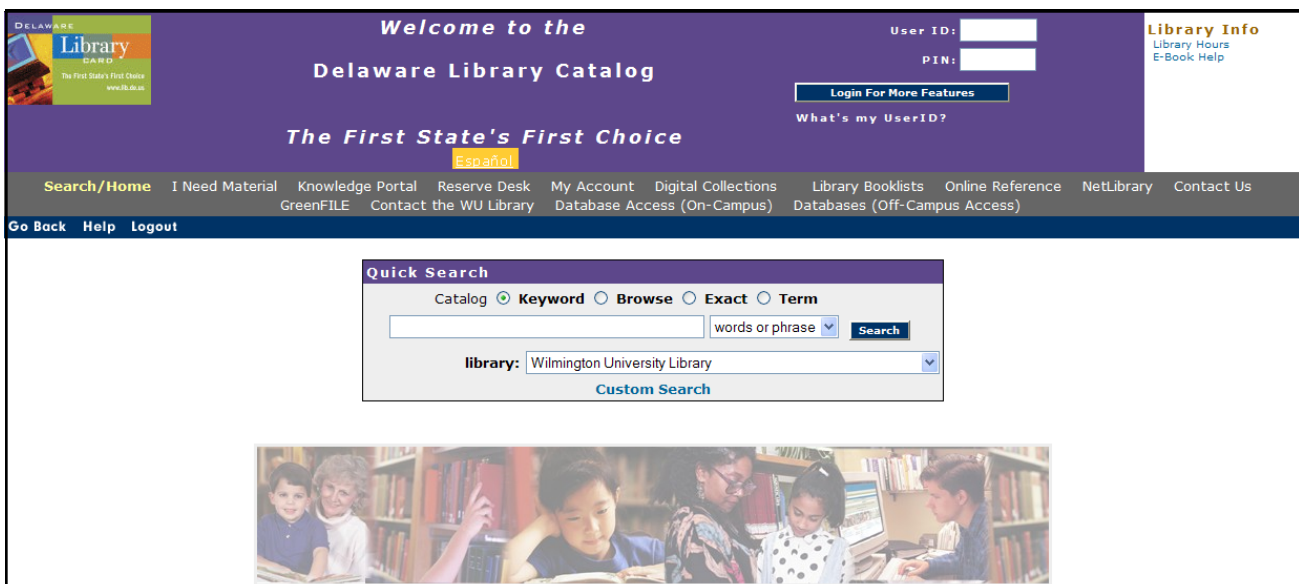
- Users will see a new interface when searching for library materials.
- Users will have the ability to also search within other public and academic library catalogs throughout Delaware. See list to left.
- Users will be able to request and borrow materials from other Delaware Libraries using the 'Hold' function.

BENEFITS OF THE NEW CATALOG SYSTEM

- The new catalog offers more detailed item descriptions which include, book summaries, table of contents, book reviews and much more!
- By joining the Delaware Library Catalog, users will now have access to the collections of over 30 libraries throughout Delaware. See list to left.
- Users can check due dates and renew items online by logging into the Delaware Catalog System.
- Your User ID is your WU ID number, which can be found on your enrollment form or on the back of your ID card. The default PIN is set to "changeme". We strongly recommend that you change your pin once logged-in.

Business Source® Complete

Company Profiles - Business Source Complete offers Datamonitor/Life Science Analytics profiles including SWOT (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, and Threats) reports for over 10,000 companies, industry reports, business descriptions, company histories, products and services, key employee/biographies, revenue and top competitors.



Annual Reviews - Annual Reviews is a full-text database covering the fields of law, social sciences, psychology and sociology. The database synthesizes the vast amount of primary research literature and identifies the principal contributions in each of these disciplines. The database also includes the table of contents for many other disciplines.

SEARCHING FOR PSYCHOLOGY E-BOOKS

PsycBOOKS®

Are you doing research on a topic related to psychology, education, psychiatric nursing, or other social sciences? If so, the Wilmington University Library offers online access to a database of psychology books called PsycBOOKS.

PsycBOOKS is a full text database of scholarly titles published by APA Books. It includes current books published by APA and classic and out-of-print books. The database also provides access to the APA/Oxford University Press Encyclopedia of Psychology. PsycBOOKS contains the PsycINFO abstract and bibliographic records of books and chapters and the full text of the book, tables of contents, and all introductory material.

As of January 2010, there are 1,915 Books and 29,276 Chapters in PsycBOOKS. The database and this list are updated monthly.

NEW ACCESS METHOD FOR LIBRARY DATABASES


Users accessing the Electronic Databases from off-campus will no longer need to log into WebCampus first. Access to the databases is now located in one convenient place on the Library homepage.

Steps to gain access to the Electronic Databases:

1. From the [Library homepage](#), choose 'Electronic Databases' beneath the 'Research' category.
2. Once a database is chosen, Off-Campus users will be directed to the WU Blackboard log-in screen.
3. After logging in, users will be directly sent into the database with full access to content.
