Tuesday, May 12

Depart USA

Depart Wilmington University campus via coach to JFK (Light snacks served). Depart from JFK International Airport aboard Aer Lingus flight #108 at 9:00 PM this evening. Meals and beverages in-flight.

Wednesday, May 13

Arrive Dublin/Belfast (L,D)

After clearing customs and immigration at Dublin Airport, claim your baggage and meet your friendly Irish driver/guide. Depart Dublin and travel north to visit the Boyne Valley Visitor Centre. Visit the mysterious tomb of Newgrange, constructed more than 5,000 years ago. On the winter solstice, sun rays enter the tomb and light the burial chamber. Continue to Carlingford and stop for a hardy lunch at Fitzpatrick's Pub. Proceed north to Downpatrick. Stop for a visit of Down Cathedral to see the reputed grave site of St. Patrick. Then drive to Belfast and check into your centrally located hotel. Some free time to explore and relax before your PROFESSORS' WELCOME RECEPTION and dinner at your hotel.

Thursday, May 14

Belfast (B,D)

After breakfast, depart for a guided tour of Belfast. See the University, the city center with ornate Victorian buildings, Donegal Square with the imposing City Hall, and the striking outdoor murals depicting the late 20th century political conflicts called "The Troubles". Continue to the Titanic Quarter for a visit of Titanic Belfast at the Thompson Dry Dock. The museum's state of the art exhibits create an unforgettable experience. Balance of day at leisure. Dinner and overnight at your hotel.

Friday, May 15

Depart Belfast and head northwest to Derry. Upon arrival, meet your local guide for a walking tour. Admire the 17th century city

walls, some of the best preserved in Europe. As in Belfast, graphic outdoor murals illustrate infamous episodes during the Troubles. See the Diamond, the main central square, St. Columb's Cathedral, the Tower Museum, and Guildhall. Visit the Bloody Sunday Memorial and the Bloody Sunday Trust Museum. Then travel to Donegal and check into your hotel. Dinner and overnight at your

hotel.

<u>Saturday, May 16</u> Drumcliffe/Knock/Westport (B,D)
Depart Donegal and drive south to Drumcliffe to see the grave of

one of Ireland's most famous poets, W. B. Yeats. Continue into County Mayo to visit Knock Shrine, one of the world's leading shrines. Here it is believed that the Virgin Mary appeared to 15 people in 1879. Then travel west to Westport, a busy and bustling town with good pubs, good shopping, and lovely mountain views. Dinner and overnight at your hotel.

Sunday, May 17

Galway/Connemara (B,L,D)

This morning, transfer to the Cathedral Of Our Lady Assumed into Heaven in Galway for a visit of this beautiful 20th century church. Next, enjoy a panoramic tour of the city. See the Spanish Arch in the Claddagh area, formerly a fishing village, Eyre Square with imposing 19th century buildings, the City Museum, and the National University of Galway. Then travel through the scenic Connemara region. Stop in the town of Moycullen to visit the Joyce Family Connemara Marble Factory. Enjoy a **light lunch in a neighborhood Irish pub.** Next, travel to the quaint village of Spiddal where the Irish language is still spoken. After some free time, drive to the Split Rock Craft Colony to see traditional Irish crafts. Return to Westport Hotel for dinner and overnight.

Monday, May 18

Cliffs of Moher/Killarney (B,D)

Depart Westport this morning. Drive through the Burren Country, a unique region of limestone hills, hearty flora, and prehistoric stone monuments. Visit the stunning Cliffs of Moher which plummet 700 feet into the Atlantic Ocean. Enjoy a short ferry boat ride across the Shannon Estuary into County Kerry. Arrive in Killarney and check into your elegant hotel. Some free time for a stroll and some retail therapy in town. This evening, drive to the scenic Gap of Dunloe for an EVENING OF TRADITIONAL ENTERTAINMENT AND DINNER AT KATE KEARNEY'S COTTAGE. Overnight in Killarney.

Tuesday, May 19 Jaunting Cart Ride/Dingle Peninsula (B,D) This morning, meet a local jarvey for a delightful horse-drawn cart ride through Killarney National Park. Then depart for a memorable drive around Dingle Peninsula, featured in David Lean's movie, "Ryan's Daughter". Stop for photos of spectacular sandy beaches, heather-covered mountains, and rocky hills. Stop in the fishing town of Dingle for lunch on your own. Try some of the best fish & chips that you have ever tasted. Continue to the western tip of the peninsula. There the scenery becomes wilder under the influence of the open Atlantic Ocean. Pass some early Christian monastic beehive huts and small fishing villages. Return to Killarney. Dinner and overnight in Killarney.

Wednesday, May 20 Cobh Heritage Centre/Dublin (B,D) Depart Killarney this morning. Drive through the rich farm lands of County Cork. Visit the Cobh Heritage Centre which depicts emigration from Ireland to the New World over the past 150 years. See the monument to Annie Moore, the first Irish immigrant to land at Ellis Island. Cobh was the last port of call for the Titanic. From Cobh, travel northeast along the coast to Killiney, an affluent, seaside suburb of Dublin overlooking Dublin Bay. Some free time to relax and explore this delightful town before dinner and overnight at Fitzpatrick Castle Hotel. After dinner, toss back a pint and visit some of the locals in one of the

friendly pubs.

Dublin highlights (B,D)

This morning, discover central Dublin on your panoramic tour. See Dublin's elegant Georgian townhomes and squares, lovely parks, shopping hubs, and stately government buildings. Visit Glasnevin Cemetery, which is a "Who's Who" of modern Irish history. Here lie Daniel O'Connell, Michael Collins, Charles Stewart Parnell and other prominent people. Then stop at Trinity College to see the old long Library and the Book of Kells, an 8th century illuminated manuscript of the Gospels penned by Irish monks. The afternoon is at leisure for independent activities in town. Meet your driver/guide later in the afternoon for transfer back to your hotel. This evening, drive to the town of Rathfarnham to TAYLOR'S THREE ROCK FOR DINNER AND A LIVELY SHOW OF TRADITIONAL IRISH MUSIC, DANCING, AND COMEDY. Overnight at Fitzpatrick Castle Hotel.

Friday, May 22

Return to the USA (B)

Sadly, your Study Abroad Tour has come to an end. Transfer to Dublin Airport. Clear US immigrations at Dublin Airport. Board your aircraft for your return flight w/ meals and beverages in flight. Arrive JFK and board your return coach to the Wilmington University Campus.

General Information

SIGHTSEEING AND ITINERARIES: Sightseeing is included as specified in the itinerary under the direction of licensed guides.

VALIDITY: All rates and conditions for travel are based on tariffs in effect at the time of printing (11/14). All prices are subject to change without notice prior to departure due to major currency fluctuations and/or unforeseen economic circumstances. In the event of an increase, an additional collection will be made. Tour price predicated on a minimum of 30 paying passengers. If there are fewer than 30 participants, tour price may be adjusted to reflect cost increases in certain tour components.

PAYMENTS: An initial deposit of \$679 pp is due to reserve space. A second payment of \$500 is due on or before January 16, 2015. Final payment is due on or prior to March 02, 2015. Payments may be made by check or credit card to Wilmington University. Some costs may be covered by student aid and/or loans.

TRAVEL DOCUMENTS: A valid U.S. Passport is required for U.S. Citizens. Passport must be valid up to six months after departure date (November 12, 2015). First and last names must match document passport exactly. A penalty will be charged for name corrections.

HOTELS: Last minute substitutions are occasionally necessary, but we try to ensure that changes result in equivalent hotels. Unless indicated, all hotels offer their standard, double-occupancy, twin bedded rooms with private baths. A limited number of single rooms is available at a supplement of \$439. While single rooms provide privacy, they are often smaller than double rooms.

HOTEL SERVICE CHARGE AND TAXES: Included.

NOT INCLUDED IN PRICE: Passport fees. Personal expenses including beverages not detailed in the itinerary, laundry, gratuities for your driver/guide, local guides, and course tuition and audit fees.

BAGGAGE: Tour members are permitted one suitcase not to exceed 50 pounds in weight and 62 linear inches (measure by adding one length, one width, plus one depth). In addition, each person is allowed one item of personal nature (purse), and one small piece of carry-on size luggage that is the complete responsibility of the tour participant (exact dimensions to follow). Excess baggage and/or weight will be subject to a charge.

AIRLINE RESPONSIBILITY: The responsibility of the participating carrier is limited. The airline concerned may not be held liable or responsible for any inconvenience, loss, damage, or injury arising out of or in connection with the tour services described herein, other than the liability under the tickets and tariff provision for carriage by air. Air transportation is Economy Class on scheduled airlines.

TRAVEL PROTECTION PLAN: Travel protection is included in the cost of your program at the discounted group rate of \$179 per person. Details of coverage are available under separate cover.
