The Pre-Law minor is not intended to prepare students to work as paralegals, and the Pre-Law minor is not approved by the American Bar Association: The Bachelor of Science degree with a concentration in Legal Studies is designed to prepare students to enter the legal field as a paralegal or legal assistant, working under the supervision of an attorney in the public, private or governmental sectors. Legal Studies students must take a minimum of 18 credits of legal specialty courses, nine credits of which must be earned through traditional face-to-face or remote synchronous instruction. The 18 credits may be satisfied with a combination of transfer courses and courses taken at Wilmington University.
