

Special Education: Autism and Severe Intellectual Disabilities Graduate Certificate

This certificate prepares master's-level educators to teach children and young adults with autism spectrum disorder, intellectual disabilities, multiple disabilities and other developmental disabilities. The coursework will equip educators with the skills to assess their students and then design and implement evidence-based instruction aligned to academic standards and functional skills. Clinical experiences embedded across the coursework will enable teachers to demonstrate mastery of the CEC Specialist Standards through performance-based tasks. **Must be a licensed educator and hold Special Education certification.**
