# **Special Education: K-12 Teacher of Students With Disabilities**

## **Graduate Certificate**

The purpose of this certificate is to prepare master's-level educators to teach students with disabilities in grades K-12. The goal is to provide candidates with the opportunity to complete research-based coursework with assignments and performance tasks aligned to the appropriate subject area and grade level in which they will teach. Teachers will gain the skills and knowledge to complete formative and summative assessments, use data to differentiate and deliver instruction, develop and implement behavior intervention plans, and collaborate with IEP/504 teams, parents and professionals to meet the needs of the students. Fieldwork/clinical experiences are embedded across the coursework.

Must be a licensed educator.
