APPRENTICESHIP OVERVIEW

At Sussex Tech Adult Education Division, we call Apprenticeship the "Other Four-Year Degree." It is the best way to learn a skilled trade and earn the most sought-after, industry recognized credential. the Journeyperson Certificate.

A Registered Apprenticeship program combines daily hands-on training through your sponsoring employer known as OJT (on-the-job training) combined with trade-related classroom instruction known as RTI (related training instruction). It is a formal system of learning and practicing your chosen career/skilled trade by earning the required RTI and OJT hours.

- Sussex Tech Adult Education Division is the sole provider of DOL-approved Apprenticeship RTI for Sussex County. Our division will provide and document your required RTI hours needed to earn your Journeyperson certificate.
- All Delaware residents and workers can enroll in apprenticeship training, with or without a sponsoring employer. While attending classes our counselors will connect you with skilled trades employers and foster the Registered Apprentice process with DOL.
- Once registered, you, your employer, and DOL manage the required OJT hours to earn the Journeyperson certificate. Once the required OJT and RTI hours are earned, you will become a Journeyperson. Most traditional trades require 576 RTI hours and 8000 OJT hours to earn the Journeyperson Certificate.

Tuition-Free Apprenticeship

- Students with Registered Apprentice status can attend apprenticeship classes tuition-free, but are required to pay \$150 registration fee.
- Tuition for registered apprentices is paid by the Delaware Department of Education Adult Trade Extension and Apprenticeship Programs Grant.
- The Apprenticeship Registration process starts July 1 and ends in early September each year.
- All Registered Apprentices must have a DOL-approved and signed Apprenticeship Agreement by August 31 of each enrollment cycle to qualify for tuition-free training.
- Apprenticeship classes usually begin in September, and end the following April.

ATTENTION: EMPLOYERS

Don't miss an opportunity to enroll your employees in apprenticeship training!

You can become a "Sponsoring Employer" and your employees can become "State Registered Apprentices."

Act now to register your employees. Call the Delaware Department of Labor Industrial Affairs Department at (302) 761-8328 or the Maryland Department of Labor Licensing and Regulation at (410) 767-2232. Ask to talk to an apprenticeship specialist.

Any Delaware resident who becomes a "state registered apprentice" or nonresident who becomes a "state registered apprentice" and works for a Delaware company can utilize their status to attend tuition-free apprenticeship classes.

Project Employment Blueprint (PEB)

Project Employment Blueprint (PEB) was developed by the State of Delaware Department of Labor, in partnership with Vo-Tech School districts. PEB is designed to provide individuals with the opportunity to complete training, which leads to employment in one of seven high-demand skilled trade occupations.

Students receive one year of technical Instruction, job placement assistance, and supportive services to ensure success. PEB works in conjunction with the Registered Apprentice Program (RAP). The mission of RAP is to foster continued success in Delaware businesses while creating a strong workforce. The State of Delaware's DOL Apprenticeship Navigator, along with the Office of Apprenticeship & Training will support participants with identifying a registered sponsor.



Notes: Driver Education is offered free of charge to all Delaware tenth grade students during the school year. Students who choose not to take the Driver Education course during the school year, or have not successfully completed the course during the school year, must pay to take Sussex Tech Adult Division's Driver Education Program. All students must have successfully completed 5 credits or 4 in block system (with at least 2 credits in English, Mathematics, Science or Social Studies) during the academic school year, and are required to bring in a copy of their final report card as proof of eligibility. Students must pass both the Classroom and Driving Segments to receive a Blue Certificate in order to obtain their Graduated Driver's License.

CANCELLATION OF COURSES

If you are 60 or better, you are eligible for a 10% discount.

OUT-OF-STATE RESIDENTS

There are no additional charges for out-of-state residents, with the exception of the apprenticeship program.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITY PROGRAMS

Individuals with a documented disability wishing to take part in any of the programs in the Sussex Tech Adult Division, including Blue Collar programs, may request reasonable accommodations. VETERAN'S REFUND POLICY

Students who are receiving Veteran's Administration (VA) assistance will be refunded their fees if they drop the course 72 hours prior to the class start date, or thereafter, based on a prorata formula (hours remaining divided by total required hours multiplied by the tuition charged.) All refunds will be mailed to the veteran's home address within 30 days of notification of a student's change of status.

TUITION ASSISTANCE

Many programs at the Sussex Tech Adult Division have been approved and certified by the Delaware Workforce Investment Board and Department of Labor for tuition assisted training monies for eligible participants. For additional information see page 14.

TUITION REFUND POLICY

- To receive a refund, student must complete and submit an official withdrawal form (with the exception of Electrical Seminar classes which are nonrefundable).
- Withdrawals received more than 3 business days prior to class start date will be refunded at 100% of the tuition cost.
- Withdrawals received within 3 business days prior to class start date will be refunded at 75% of the tuition cost.
- · No refund after class start date, unless indicated on payment plan.
- · Certificate program students should refer to their Payment Plan Agreement for refund details.
