


How to Print Your ACCUPLACER Scores

1. Immediately upon completion of your ACCUPLACER® test, your Individual Score Report (ISR) will appear with your scores and course placement.
2. Scroll to the bottom of the ISR; at the bottom right corner you will see a print button. If the computer you are using is connected to a printer, you can print your scores.

Please note:

- It is possible for a WritePlacer essay to receive a score of zero. This could be due to the essay being: blank, illegible/incoherent, too short, foreign language, or off topic.
- Occasionally the scoring system is unable to determine the best match for the essay against the overall rubric and has requested a human evaluator to review the essay so that the most appropriate score is given. These essays are given a score of "Pending". If you receive a Pending score, please wait 24 hours and contact the Student Success Center (SSC) for your final score.
- If you see scores, but do not see a course placement, please contact the SSC.
